LIGHT COMPANY TO RESIST ORDINANCE

President Harries Informs Mayor and Council His Firm Cannot Accept New Terms.

CUTS RETURNS TO 5 PER CENT

President Harries of the Omaha Electric Light and Power company has advised the mayor and council by letter that enforcement of the new electric rate and power ordinance would result in less than 5 per cent returns on the assessed valuation of the plant.

The ordinance becomes operative May 19 unless action is taken by the city council.

Assistant City Attorney Lambert states it is up to the company to show wherein the proposed rates are unreasonable, and he adds that if the company shows a sincere desire to disclose their operations he believes the city legal department would agree to hearing the company before taking further action.

Reduced Schedule. The ordinance to which the light company now objects is the result of ordinances offered by the mayor and Commissioner Butler. The new schedule places the primary rate at 5 cents and the secondary at 1/2 cent per kilowatt hour for residence lighting and a reduced schedule for other classifications.

President Harries' Answer. The communication received from President Harries of the light company reads:

OMAHA, May 13, 1915.—The Mayor and City Council, Omaha, Neb.: Gentlemen: The Omaha Electric Light and Power company, having information as to the passage of what is commonly known as the Butler ordinance, approved Tuesday, May 4, requests your honorable body to

reconsider the legislation in question for reasons herein set forth. The ordinance provides for the perpetuating of the rate-fixing method which has caused serious, although logical, local criticism of this rendered for electric energy a method which the company—in response to popular demand—intended to voluntarily abolish and to substitute therefor a schedule which would be simpler and more acceptable to consumers.
