

NEW YORK STOCK MARKET Heaviness, Mostly Due to Foreign Situation, Marks Day's Session.

NEW YORK, May 13.—Heaviness, resulting almost wholly from latest reports in international affairs, attended today's unusually dull stock market. Prices moved up and down, according to the caprices of the trading element, which had sole command of the day's operations.

General news was of a mixed character, the resumption of dividends, even though in the form of scrip on Virginia-Carolina Chemicals preferred being regarded as an indication of better industrial conditions in the south.

There was also increased inquiry for copper metal at the highest prices recently recorded, while the placing of a small loan by the Bolivian government here directly upon the market.

New low quotations for francs and lire were the feature of the foreign exchange market, this being partly offset by a better tendency for remittances in London.
