OMAHA, N. T., Dec. 28, 1852. Mrs. Amelia Bloomer... The subsequent developments as a consequence are related in the Examiner as follows:

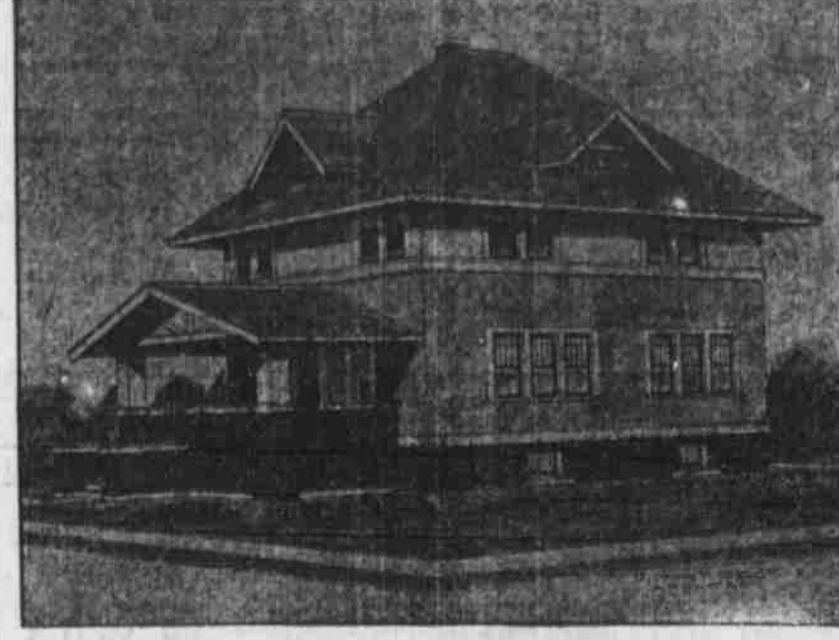

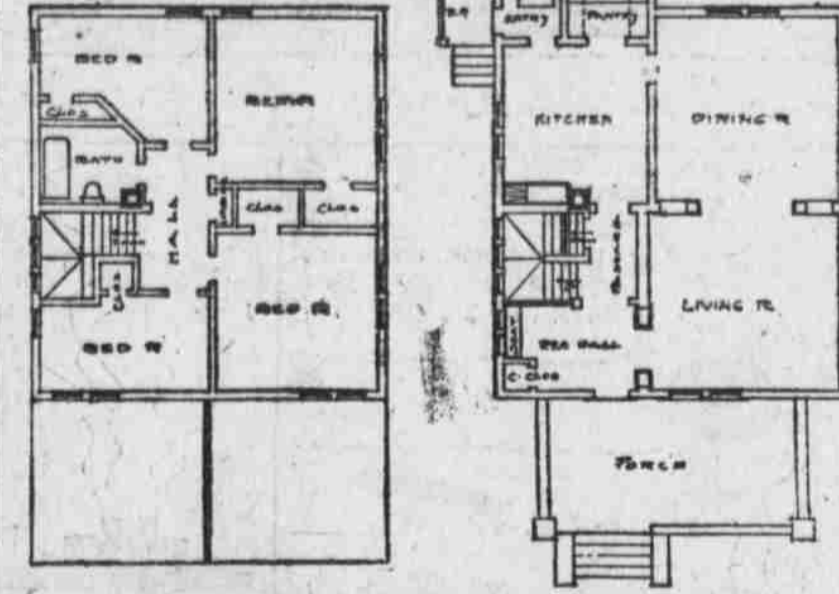
