FIFTY-MILLION CONTRACT IS GIVEN TO ONE FIRM

(Correspondence of the Associated Press.) SYDNEY, May 30.—Public works involving an expenditure of more than \$50,000,000, including ten railway lines, two water conservation schemes, harbor works and a canal project, are provided for in a single contract just signed by the New South Wales government with an Anglo-Australian contracting firm, Norton Griffiths & Co. The contractors agree to finance the operations, which will be done in accordance with plans drawn up by the department of public works. The government will allow the firm a profit of 5 per cent on the entire cost of construction.
