NEW YORK STOCK MARKET OFFICER FIMPLE

Strength and Breadth Reminder of March Sessions During Great Advance.

U. S. STEEL SHARES LEAD ALL

NEW YORK, June 1-In its consisten strength and increasing breadth, today's stock market served as a striking reminder of the daily sessions which accompanied the memorable advance of last March and April. Trading did not attain the large proportions of that period, but was of sufficient extent to make the movement noteworthy.

movement noteworthy.
United States Steel led the advance, dealings in that stock aggregating about 150,009 shares or 25 per cent of the whole. Coppers were next in favor, with average gains of 262 points on a very large joint turnover.

gains of 29s points on a very area joint turnover.

War specialties were comparatively in-conspicuous, although advances in that group were of a substantial character, the same being true of the automobile shares and other issues having no spe-cial classification. General Motors made the greatest gain of any specialties, ad-vancing 10% points, half a score of the railway investment stocks, mainly those in the international list, rose 1651 points, but the demand for these issues was rela-tively light.

but the demand for these issues was relatively light.

The advance in Steel to 50%, its best quotation since the beginning of the strain in relations between this country and Germany, was made the occasion of much gossip and conjecture. It is known that the corporation's output has increased during the last fortnight and this favorable condition is expected to show in the May tonnage figures, to be issued a week from today. Not until the close of the market was it learned that the Steel corporation had won the suit brought against it by the federal government.

The further rise in the copper group was traceable to a number of specific causes, including the greater demand for the metal at high prices. Moreover, it is argued that the new turn in the Mexican situation is calculated to work to the advantage of the many large producing and smelting companies which have large properties in the southern republic.

Many of the day's highest quotations were made in the final hour, closing prices showing no material recessions from that level, despite considerable profit taking. Sales amounted to 75,003 shares.
