Statistics hastily compiled by Duane Arnold of the National Fur and Tanning company, indicate that during the last year seventeen concerns at different Nebraska points, including five at Cmaha, received 114,000 bundles of blues, valued at \$657,000, and to put them in barrels would have cost the shipper a tremend-


