PRIZE COURT TO SETTLE IT

England Says if Wilhelmina Seized Cargo Will Be Submitted to Tribunal.

OWNERS TO BE INDEMNIFIED

LONDON, Feb. 5.—Great Britain has decided that if the American steamer Wilhelmina, now on its way with a cargo of foodstuffs for Germany, is intercepted, its cargo will be submitted to a prize court, so that the new situation arising out of the action of Germany in ordering that all grain and flour shall be placed under control of the government may be regularized.

There is no question of taking any proceedings against the vessel and the owners of the vessel will be indemnified for any delay caused to it, and the ship-owners of the cargo compensated for any loss caused to them by the action of the British authorities.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 4.—Not until the American steamer Wilhelmina, now on the high seas, is seized by the British government, will the State department declare itself on today's suggestion from Count Bernstorff, German ambassador, that an American consular officer supervise the distribution of its food cargo.

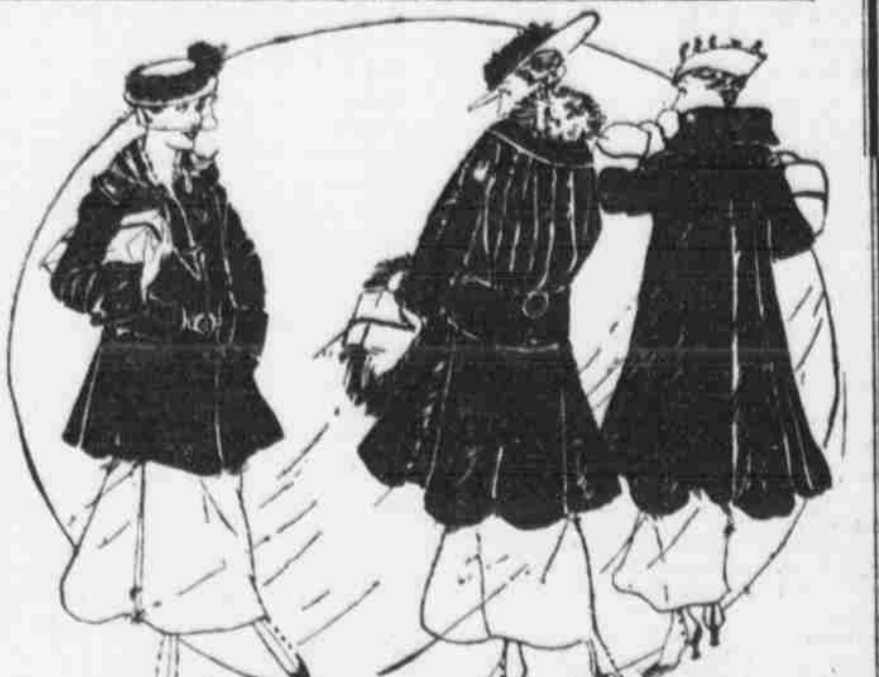
