INDUCEMENT TO SAVE MONEY

Postmaster Wharton Tells What the Postal Saving Banks of the Country Are Doing.

MANY CHILDREN DEPOSITORS

"Postal savings in Omaha have increased at an extraordinary rate in the last six months," said Postmaster Wharton. "They have increased even faster than the country-wide postal savings."

"Total deposits in postal banks on the first day of this year were \$3,000,000. That sum was \$10,000,000 more than total deposits August 1, 1914, which was about the time the European war started."

"An advantage of the postal savings bank is its facilities for tracing the heirs of deceased depositors. The government will put forth every effort to find the rightful heirs, no matter how small the balance left by the deceased."

"In nearly every instance the State department has aided in the search for the heirs. Recently a Russian was drowned in the Susquehanna river near Wilkesbarre, Pa. He had \$50 in his credit in the postal savings bank at Wilkesbarre, but no record of any relatives. A Russian society paid his funeral expense and then the department went to work to search the world over for any possible heirs."

"Within two months the agent parents were found in Brno, Omaha, Tomastub, government of Suwalki, Russia, and the \$50, with interest, was paid to them."
