

GERMANS STORM PRZASINSZ CITY

Strongly Fortified Town in Poland Captured by Prussian Reserves, Says Berlin Report.

TAKE TEN THOUSAND PRISONERS

BERLIN, Feb. 25—(Via London)—The town of Przasinsz, Russian Poland, was yesterday taken by storm by German forces, according to official announcement given out in Berlin today. The Germans captured 10,000 Russian prisoners.

The report is dated February 25 and reads as follows: In Western Areas. "In the Western Area of the War-In Champagne the enemy yesterday continued his desperate efforts, which, in spite of the strong forces engaged, were again absolutely without success. Otherwise, there has been nothing of importance on the western front."

"In the eastern areas: The engagements on the Memel, Bohr and Narew rivers. The town of Przasinsz, in Russian Poland, which had been extensively fortified, was stormed yesterday by the East Prussian reserves. After a stubborn fight we were victorious, capturing more than 10,000 prisoners, over fifty cannons, a large number of machine guns, and a very large amount of war material."

"In other engagements fought north of the Vistula in the last few days we have taken 3,000 Russian prisoners."

For Poland, south of the Vistula, the Russians advanced to Modz, which is southwest of Bolimow, and occupied this position. Their forces in this movement outnumbered ours five to one. Otherwise there is nothing of importance to report in this region.

"It is characteristic that the commander of the Fifty-seventh Russian reserve division, taken prisoner at Augustow, asked German officers whether it was true that Antwerp was being besieged by the Germans and would soon fall. When the situation on the western front was explained to this Russian officer he refused to believe that the German western army was on French soil."

Concentrate Large Forces. **PETROGRAD (Via London), Feb. 25—**The Germans appear to have concentrated large forces near Przasinsz, the center of their attack in the region north of the Vistula. The action about Osovoets is becoming less intense. Serious fighting is reported also further north, at Shabin and Yantramb, points between Grodno and Augustow.

According to official comment the German officers exaggerated the magnitude of their victories along the East Prussian front and from the Russian viewpoint the fighting in northern Poland is "only now beginning."

A Russian officer expressed the view that the German claims were made in the hope of offsetting what he termed the loss of sympathy by neutral powers as a result of Germany's submarine campaign.

In Galicia the Austro-German forces have occupied a new front extending from the Carpathians to Stanislau. The chert, aortic feature of this front is its thickness. The rear of the Austro-German line touches Roumanian. The line of communication is maintained, not from the rear, but from the flanks, being parallel with the Carpathians.

The German official statement today announced that Przasinsz, referred to above, was stormed.

French Official Report. **PARIS, Feb. 25—(Via London)**—At the war office this afternoon the following statement was given out: "Near Lombarayde our artillery demolished a blockhouse and some of the enemy's lookouts."

"In Champagne we have maintained the new positions which we won yesterday. All of the enemy's counter attacks were repulsed. Our aviators threw sixty bombs on railway stations, trains and concentrations of the enemy. This bombardment was very effective."

"In the Argonne, at Martheuse the enemy made an attack which immediately was checked." "Between the Artois and the Meuse in the Cheppy Wood, we made further progress."

"Our heavy artillery destroyed armored shelters. The enemy was unable to take trenches captured by us." "At Lorraine near Farnet there was a skirmish between patrols, the Germans being put to flight."

BLAIR MAN STABBED IN MIDNIGHT QUARREL

BLAIR, Neb., Feb. 25—(Special Telegram)—Last night Cash Phillips and wife, accompanied by Broth Halstead, went to the home of Victor Smith and family to spend the evening at cards and other amusements. Smith and Phillips had spent most of the day in Calhoun and had returned with Smith badly under the influence of whisky.

Late at night they became involved in a quarrel, resulting in the stabbing of Phillips by Smith in half a dozen places, Smith using his pocketknife. While Phillips is not seriously injured, some of his wounds are deep.

Sheriff Compton and Policeman Frank Brooks arrested Smith and after a hard struggle landed him in the county jail. Smith's hearing is set for Friday and young Halstead is held under \$100 bond as a witness.

CHARGES GERMAN WITH ALL SORTS OF ATROCITIES

WASHINGTON, Feb. 25—The Russian ambassador, George Baklanoff, sent the State department today a memoir from his government charging Germany and Austria with violations of the Geneva Red Cross convention and of part of The Hague convention with mutilation and killing of wounded Russians, with pushing to death Russian prisoners, with attacks on the Russian and Austrian civil population of Germany and Austrian territory, the use by Austrians of dum-dum bullets, and the desecration and pillaging of churches.

The document was presented to the State department. It was stated, not as a protest, but as a matter of information.

SHIP DEPTFORD IS SUNK IN NORTH SEA

Small British Freight steamer Sent to Bottom of Scarborough by a Mine or Torpedo.

COASTER IS SUNK IN CHANNEL

LONDON, Feb. 25—One sailor lost his life when the small British steamer Deptford, 230 feet long and 1,208 tons, was sent to the bottom in twenty minutes, either by a German torpedo from a submarine or by coming in contact with a mine in the North Sea at 3 o'clock yesterday morning at a point off Scarborough. The fifteen other members of the steamer's crew were saved and were landed at South Shields at an early hour this morning.

The engineer of the Deptford says he was on duty in the stoke hold at the time the explosive in the torpedo head, or in the mine, rent the Deptford in twain. He says he saw a blue flame shoot up from the bottom of the ship and through its deck. The force of the explosion threw him violently and stunned him. He managed to reach the deck, however, as the vessel was heeling and just as the lifeboat was launched. It was the carpenter of the Deptford who lost his life. After hours in an open and leaking boat in a snowstorm, which caused them to suffer cruelly, the men say they signaled a steamer, but no notice was taken of their appeal. Later, however, they encountered the steamer Fulgata, which picked them up and brought them into South Shields.

Some of the members of the crew say they saw the wake of a submarine after the Deptford was struck.

RUSS HAVE BACKS TO WALL

Muscovite Forces Reported to Have Made Stand on Northern Rivers Against Germans.

LITTLE CHANGE IN CARPATHIANS

LONDON, Feb. 25—A wireless report from Berlin says that further obstacles have arisen to prevent the invasion of Russia, and this would seem to confirm reports from Petrograd that the Russians are making a successful stand against the invaders along their fortress line on the northern river. "The Russians, from all accounts are also holding back the Austrians in Bukovina and it is stated in an official dispatch that they have recaptured the important railway center of Stanislau. There has been little or no change in the Carpathians, where fighting of the most severe character has been going on for nearly two months."

With regard to the western arena, the French have been making a long-sustained effort to advance, and in the Vosges are apparently the only centers of fighting of importance. A good deal of significance is attached by military circles to the operations near Verdun, as a successful offensive by the French there would relieve Rheims. The campaign to the northwest of Verdun has a similar object in view, the

French hoping to drive the Germans from Montfaucon, which has been strenuously fortified, and thus deliver a fatal blow to the German plan for capturing Verdun.

Germany's Reply to Italy is Friendly

LONDON, Feb. 25—A Rome dispatch to the Morning Post says: "The German reply to Italy's memorandum on the blockade of British coasts has reached the government here. The note declares that in view of the friendly relations between Germany and Italy, Germany will respect the Italian flag."
