PIONEER ENGINEER IS DEAD

Albert L. Johnson, War Veteran, Secretary of Locomotive Engineers Passes Away.

IS TO BE BURIED SUNDAY

Albert L. Johnson, a resident of Douglas county since 1874, died at his home in Benson yesterday, aged 69 years, death being caused by heart failure.

Mr. Johnson was born in Hancock county, Ohio, February 22, 1846. When a boy, with his parents, he moved to Milan, Ind., receiving his education. During the war he served in Company A, 139th regiment, Indiana Volunteer Infantry, and was discharged, receiving honorable mention at the close of his services.

From the time of entering the railroad service, Mr. Johnson was an active member in the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers. For twenty-two years he was secretary and treasurer of his lodge. In 1912 he was a member of the grand lodge of the order.
