

FRENCH MANUFACTURES IN HANDS OF GERMANS

(Correspondence of the Associated Press.) BERLIN, March 18.—The war has placed almost half of the manufacturing industries of France into the hands of

the Germans, according to statistics gathered by Dr. E. Schroeder, secretary of the Germany Iron Manufacturers' association. He finds that not less than 43 per cent of the steam power in France is in the districts occupied by the Germans. The highest percentage is in the textile industries, where nearly 60 per cent of the

power is now in German hands. The mining industries, including quarries, follow with 60.5 per cent, and the iron and metal working industries are not far behind with 54 per cent. The food products industries, chemical, paper and book-making and electricity, all have between 30 to 45 per cent of their power in Ger-
