Percentage of Increase. The new rates are expected to increase the incomes of the railroads approximately 1% per cent. All the principal east and west saytems will benefit by the increases, as their liens traverse the territory affected.

The commodities upon which no advances were allowed compose approximately 25 per cent of the total volume of traffic in the central territory.

The commission held the income of the railroads was smaller than is demanded in public interest, but that no showing had been made warranting a general increase in rates.

Public Misled. Condemning what is characterized as a propaganda to influence its decision, the
