YOUNG HORSES NOT INJURED

Golfers of the United States Double in Number—Investments in Golf Courses is Now Enormous.

NEW YORK, Aug. 8.—There is a lot of weight in the argument of the Federal league sluggers that separate averages ought to be kept for the left and right-hand batters.

It is pointed out that a left-handed batter ought to hit from fifteen to forty paces ahead of the right-handed batter.

The right-handed man stands at the off side of the plate, from the first base direction. When he swings the exertion pulls his body farther away from the plate and shifts him in the direction of third base.

With the port side clubber it's different. When he stands at the plate he has a foot or so nearer first base than home plate is itself.

It is pointed out that a left-handed batter ought to get at least twenty more hits each season than a right-handed batter.

Stories of Frame-Ups Coming Thick and Fast from Europe.

WOULD INVESTIGATE THEM

American Followers of Pugilistic Bouts Inclined to Demand that Charges Be Run Down by the Committee.

NEW YORK, Aug. 8.—Stories of double crossing and frame-ups continue to reach these shores from Europe, and the impression grows daily that the recent battle between Jack Johnson and Frank Moran furnished the worst blow that the boxing game has suffered in some years.

Three different versions of the alleged fake have come to these shores. The first, which was announced for the ostensible purpose of proving that Moran had done his best against the negro, was to the effect that Johnson had insisted on Moran being "knocked out" by him in the eighth round before he would agree to a match with the Pittsburgher.

Not complimentary to Carpenter. The latest story of the peculiar deal is the most interesting of all and it is in no way complimentary to Georges Carpenter, the French heavyweight, who returned. This story has it that an arrangement had been made with Carpenter whereby he was to award the decision to Moran if the latter was able to make any kind of a showing by outboxing Johnson even in a few of the rounds.
