Attack of Berge With Much Pain

(From a Staff Correspondent.) LINCOLN, Aug. 16.—(Special Telegram.)—Provoked to indignation by George W. Berge's eleventh hour attack, Governor Morehead today said this was simply a rebash of attacks indulged in throughout the campaign and sounded very much like the "wall of a drowning man grasping at straws."

"The officer of governor" said he, "is the highest state honor within the gift of the people of Nebraska. In aspring to this I would think all men would map out campaigns for upbuilding their party and their state instead of strewing their pathways with the character and integrity of their opponents."

"Coming as they do, these attacks of Mr. Berge upon me, I am frank to say, are not only rank insinuations, but are unfair, untrue and beneath my notice. I do not intend to reply to them. I am willing to leave my record as a private citizen and as an official to the democrats of this state."

A Good Reason Why. Although Roger Bresnahan admits that he recently had a fancy for managing the St. Louis Cardinals next year, he declares that he has no idea of leaving the Cubs. Bresnahan has earned \$90,000 in organized base ball in the last three years.
