Wheat is Reported to Have Been Stacked by Farmers. FLOUR SITUATION IS STRONG

Millers Have Only Little Stock Product in Storage—Corn Strong, with Many Old Bulls on Buying Side.

Secretary E. J. Smiley of the Kansas Grain Dealers' association in an interview says that Kansas has raised 180,000,000 bushels of wheat and that 40 per cent of this crop is still in the stock on farms.

Corn losses in Kansas were heavy because of the lack of moisture in some sections and the late planting in other times over nearly the entire state.

Wheat values will continue to pivot on the war situation. As viewed from an impartial standpoint, the shipment of wheat at war will be obliged to import enormous quantities of grain and nearly all of this wheat must come from the United States.

The flour situation at Chicago as well as the rest of the country is in a position of years. Millers have a surplus of flour to sell abroad, as the domestic trade is about being exhausted.
