BULLETIN. LONDON, Sept. 6-The Rome correspondent of the Exchange Telegraph company says dispatches from Vienna announce that following its success at Lemberg the Russian center has suddenly begun a movement northward against the flank of the armies under the Austrian generals, Aufenbur and Dankel, who have been successfully operating against Lublin and Zjamohac.

PETROGARD, Sept. 5 .- Grand Duke Nicholas, commander-in-chief of the Russian forces, has issued a general order providing for the military administration of all foreign territory as fast as it is occupied by the Russian troops.

The order calls for the creation of a special province consisting of the territory occupied in Austria-Hungary and the placing of it under the administration of the commander of the armies operating in the theater of war in the southwest.
