GERMANS ESCAPE FROM CLEVER TRAP

General Joffre Misses One of the Greatest Victories in History by a Narrow Margin.

TEUTONS CHANGE THEIR PLANS Show Resourcefulness by a Sharp Counter Movement—Match Between Masters in Art of War.

PARIS, Sept. 12.—The admirable discipline of the censorship was swayed by yesterday's communications, which showed that the only ones outside the military authorities who knew of the whereabouts of the French force at the beginning of the great battle were the Germans. The latter learned of it none too soon, and their diversion from the route to Paris, heretofore attributed to fear of the Paris defense works, was simply a clever maneuver to escape a desperate situation.

The Germans penetrated France in three columns, but the force consisted of five armies and at least 800,000 men. The plan evidently was for a quick direct attack on Paris by General von Kluck, while the armies of General von Below, the prince of Wurtemberg and Saxony and the crown prince dealt with the other armies of the allies.

German General Saves Day. The audacious commander of the German right wing, surprised by the resistance of the allies at Guis and Compiègne, was cautious and must have discovered the presence of the army of Paris on his flank. He showed his resourcefulness by a sharp, counter movement against this protecting force. The critics give Von Kluck full credit for skill as well as hardihood and referring to General Joffre's plans, say it is a match between masters in the art of war.

SOLDIER DESCRIBES STRUGGLE AT MONS

temporarily. After the main body had crossed, the bridge was blown up, leaving the two outpost companies to get across as best they could by boats or swimming. Most of them managed to reach the main body again.

The main body raced from the town and fell back through open country being kept moving all night. When daylight arrived it was apparent from higher ground that Mons had been practically blown away by the German artillery.

"All throughout the morning we continued to fight a rear guard action, but the steady march in retreat did not stop until 5 o'clock in the evening, when we found ourselves well out of range of the German artillery. In a quiet valley where all the troops were ordered to rest and eat. As they had been without food since the previous morning's breakfast, it was rather amusing to see the soldiers going into the turnip fields and eating turnips.

Aerial Duel Witnessed.

"During the afternoon, both the German and British armies watched a duel in the air between French and German aeroplanes. The Frenchman was wonderfully clever and succeeded in maneuvering himself to the upper position, which he gained after fifteen minutes of reckless effort. Then the Frenchman began blasting away at the German with a revolver. At his head he fired and the wounded German attempted to glide down into his own lines. The glide, however, ended in the British lines near my detachment, the West Kent Infantry. We found the aviator dead when we reached the machine. We buried him and burned the aeroplanes.

GERMAN CROWN PRINCE WANTS CIGARS FOR MEN

BERLIN, Sept. 12.—Crown Prince Frederick William has telegraphed the Lokai Anzeiger as follows:

"Please collect great quantities of tobacco and cigars for the men of my army. Get them here as quickly as possible."

ISLANDS OCCUPIED BY BRITISH FORCES

Landing Party Hoists New Flag Over Principal City of the Bismarck Archipelago.

LITTLE RESISTANCE OFFERED

German Officer in Command of Parties in Trench Five Hundred Yards from Station Surrenders Unconditionally.

LONDON, Sept. 12.—The admiralty announced this afternoon that the British fleet has occupied Herberishon, on Blanche bay, the seat of government of the German Bismarck archipelago and the Solomon Islands.

The official press bureau gave out the following statement this afternoon:

"A telegram has been received from Rear Admiral Sir George E. Pauley, commanding the British navy, announcing the occupation at 7 a. m. September 11, of the town of Herberishon in the island of New Pommern, (late New Britain). The British flag was hoisted without opposition.

Villa Asks Uncle Sam to Remove His Men from Vera Cruz

MEXICO CITY, Sept. 12.—General Silvano Obregon last night telegraphed to General Carranza a request from General Villa that the constitutionalist chief remove the Washington government to remove the United States troops from Vera Cruz.

Ammunition Train Taken by French

LONDON, Sept. 12.—The Daily Telegraph correspondent at Nanteuil, department of Oise, in a dispatch dated Thursday, dealing with the turning of the tide in favor of the allies, gives his impression, derived in conversation with many wounded French officers from the fighting line. From this he learns that the German army, meeting for the first time troops almost equal in number, has been rolled up and sorely troubled and the right of the army, composed of some of the finest German forces, has retired so far that the center must give way or risk the line of communication.

Great Famine Faces Chinese Provinces

WASHINGTON, Sept. 12.—Twelve months' famine, which only outside aid can avert, faces the Kwang Tung and Kwang Si provinces of China, which were devastated by flood in July with a loss of 3,000 lives and more than 100,000 homes.
