Aliens in United Kingdom Bother to Government Heads

LONDON, Sept. 19-The number of "alien enemies" in the United Kingdom, which is estimated at from 50,000 to 80,000, including women and children, daily becomes a matter of more concern.

Most of the better class have received police permits to remain at liberty, reporting at stated times to the police stations. Of these many continue in employment, but the discharging of clerks, teachers, governosses and servants of German or Austrian birth is becoming more common as the war feeling grows. The women, who are required to register with the police, are supported by charitable funds or out of the 200,000 marks appropriated by the German government for the relief of subjects in England. But the vast majority of unemployed and penniless, who are a charge society and a source of concern to the police, have been gathered into var-

fous detention camps. At one of these camps at Aldershot there are over 2,000 inmates. They live in a tent city within a barbed wire enclosure. As an extra inducement to remain inside the barbed wire, the prisoners are deprived of their shoes. Other large camps are at Liverpool and Mauchester. It is expected that the prisoners will soon be put to work in the fields, of the triple entente.




