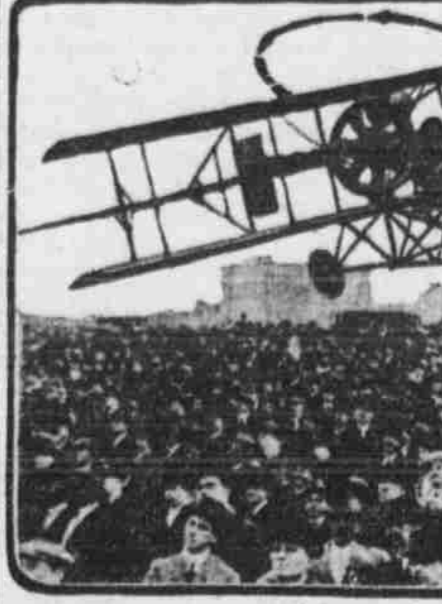

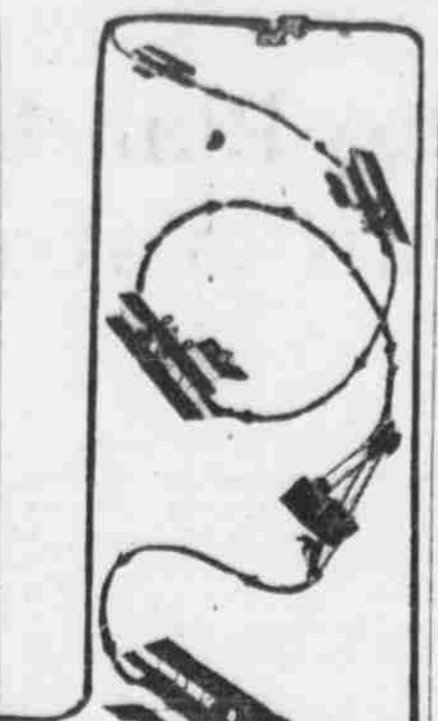

REVIEW OF STATE DEBATERS

Most Interesting Publication Tells of Laurels Won by University.

PICTURES OF THE TEAMS

History of the Debaters is Dedicated to Prof. Fogg, Head of the Rhetoric Department of the University.

One of the most interesting publications that has ever come from the University of Nebraska undergraduate body was issued Saturday by the Nebraska chapter of Delta Sigma Rho, the national honor society of intercollegiate debaters.

An Omaha alumnus, Auan Raymond, '11, law, '12, contributes the main article, "Arma Virumque," which traces the early debaters (1870-1901).

The pictures of the twenty-six Nebraska debating teams the last thirteen years, with a concise account of each contest, are given, followed by a list of the one hundred and twenty-two students who held membership in the intercollegiate debating degrees and positions at Nebraska and at eighteen other universities;

The Omaha High school has seven graduates in this list and South Omaha two. Lincoln leads with seventeen. The Omaha representatives are:
