

The advance of 25 cents on hard coal freight rates has again been suspended, this time until March 17, 1915. This proposed advance was originally suspended at the instance of the Commercial club Omaha. The traffic bureau has just received word that it has been resusmded. In the meantime a hearing is to be held by the Interstate Commerce commission to determine whether the advance is justified and whether it shall be allowed to go into effect.

COUNTY TO SUE BONNESS COMPANY ON CONTRACT

Since the marked increases in the price of foodstuffs, especially meats, the Fred Honness Provision company is alleged to have been guilty of a breach of contract to supply provisions to the county institutions. The Board of County Commissioners have therefore passed a resolution notifying the Bonness company that hereafter the county will buy such provisions in the open market, and will start suit against the company to collect damages for the alleged failure to keep the MILTECL.

FAIR APPROPRIATION IS PASSED BY COUNTY DADS

An appropriation of \$4,335 to the Douglas County Agricultural society for the 1914 county fair, to be held at Elkhorn, has been passed by the board of county comdoners. The amount is based on a se-cent allowance for each inhabitant. In the resolution authorizing the approlation, the county board declares that f the law on the subject, recently passed and now being contested in the supreme Sourt, is upheld and additional 2 centa inhabitant will be appropriated, raisthe total amount to about \$7,000.


