The Platform.

Headed by the quotation: "Education is a better safeguard to a nation than a standing army," the socialist platform follows:

We demand free discussion of all questions which the owners of public school buildings desire to discuss therein. We demand that all properties held by militarism in our public schools be discontinued, the high school cadets be disbanded and that education be carried on against the boy scout movement.

We demand that the size of the classes be reduced to admit of the greatest efficiency in teaching, and that ample provisions for school buildings be made. We demand that all properties held by private institutions under the pretext of being school property and not used for that purpose shall be taxed in the same manner as all other property.
