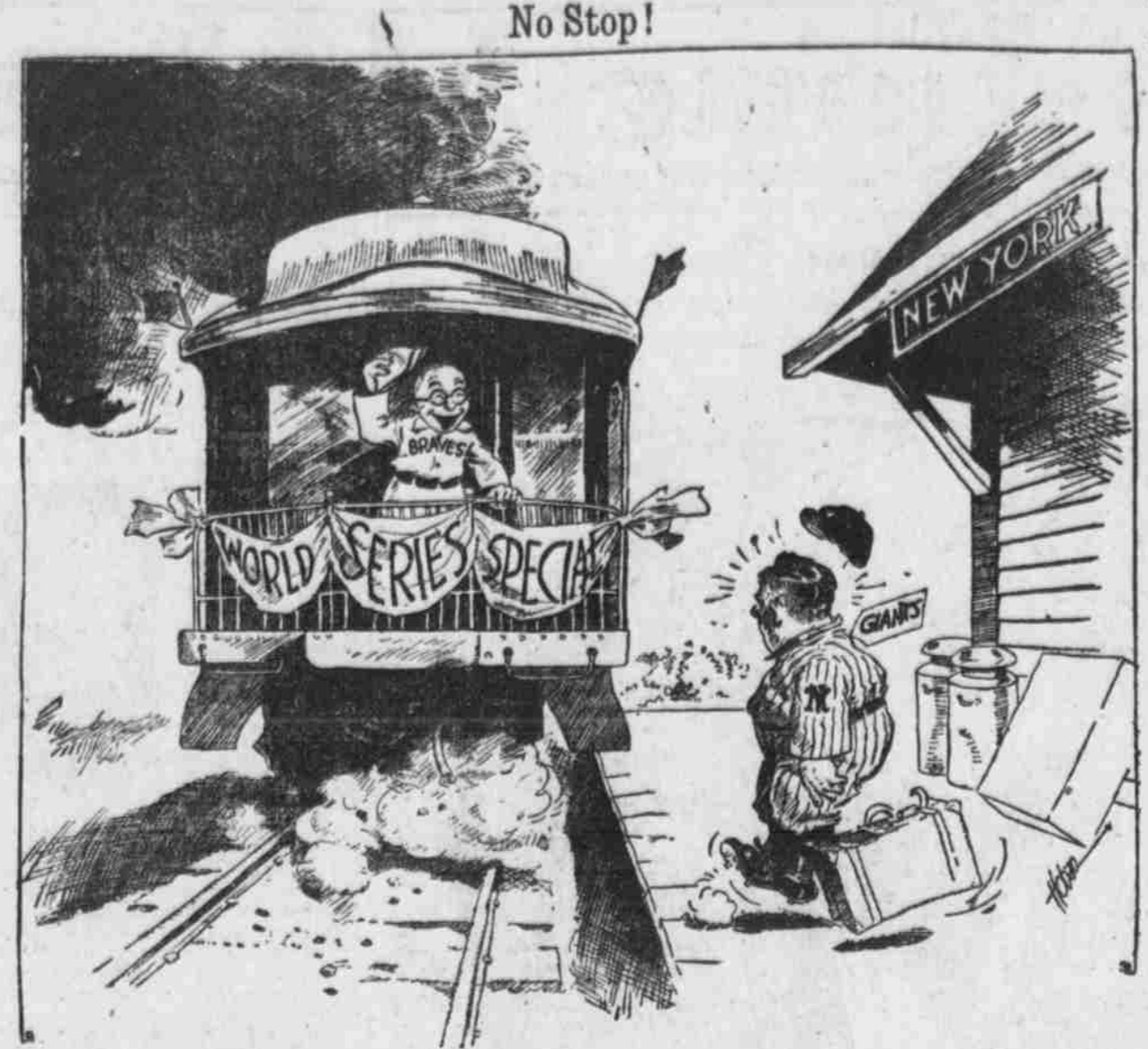
Easily Take Fourth Game of Series from Boston. FINAL SCORE IS ELEVEN TO FIVE
