

MEAT PRICES HAVE DROPPED

Round Steak Has Dropped to Seven-teen and Half Cents a Pound. WAS TWENTY-EIGHT CENTS

Meats Are Down a Dollar a Hundred Wholesale and Chickens Are Selling for Fifteen Cents a Pound.

A substantial drop in meat prices is the feature of the market on necessities of life this week.

Round steak, which snared out of sight for a period of months, has dropped back to 17 1/2 cents a pound.

Both green and ripe tomatoes are still abundant and will likely be on the market until frost cuts them off.

Apples of various kinds and splendid quality can be had at what are considered low prices for the time of year and the quality.

Sugar has taken a welcome drop, however small, so that sixteen pounds are sold for \$1 now where but fifteen were sold a week ago.

Voters Will Have Five Ballots for the Next Election

Voters will have to handle five ballots, one of which will be seven feet and one-half long, and must pass on four proposed constitutional amendments and three statutes under the referendum at the November election.

Democratic candidates will be first on the ballot, the progressives next and the republicans third, this order being based on the vote cast at the last election for governor.
