LOCAL NEWS PAY CLAIMED BY ACTING GOVERNOR IN CONTROVERSY

Suit of Lieutenant Governor Barrows Submitted to District Court Upon Briefs.

The suit of Lieutenant Governor P. A. Barrows for the recovery of \$900 from the state as salary for time served by him as acting governor during the absence of Governor Kelly from state has been submitted to the district court of Lancaster county upon briefs. W. T. Thompson, attorney for Mr. Barrows, contends that the constitution of the state must be strictly construed, that it means what it says when it says the lieutenant governor shall be acting governor in the absence of the governor from the state or on account of vacancy in the office or disability of the governor, and shall be entitled to the emoluments thereof.

C. L. Dorr, assistant attorney general, filed an objection to the suit which he takes the position that the lieutenant governor has been paid for his services, and this includes as acting governor, that being one of the duties imposed by the constitution upon the lieutenant governor. He contends the constitution does not contemplate two governors, and unless the governor abandons his office there is a real vacancy in the office; the lieutenant governor cannot receive pay as acting governor. He says a temporary absence from the state, or where the governor is within call and can attend to all important duties of his office, the lieutenant governor is not entitled to extra pay above his own salary. No appropriation has been made for paying a lieutenant governor for time served as temporary acting governor and the auditor is powerless to pay the Barrows claim owing to lack of funds.

Cases are cited to show an acting official is not always entitled to pay for his services. It is suggested that the constitution makes the pay of lieutenant governor double that of a senator, and that this may have been done to compensate the lieutenant governor for temporary service as governor. It is inferred that the lieutenant governor never ceases to be lieutenant governor. If he does he cannot act as governor.—Lincoln State Journal.

MOURN PASSING OF MANN.

Washington, Dec. 1.—The capital today mourned the passing of a veteran congressional leader—Representative James R. Mann of Illinois. Death, which followed a short illness, came at 11:15 p. m. yesterday. Pneumonia was the cause. His death was a shock to official Washington, as few of his friends knew that he was seriously ill.

The house, on meeting today was to pay brief tribute to Mann's memory and make arrangements for sending a delegation to his funeral which probably will be held in Chicago, his home.

Mann's death removed not only one of the most experienced legislators in the house, but one of the men of recognized personal force and power.

Mann was chairman of the powerful committee on committees, which assigns house members to committee places and in this position his control over the destinies of members was probably greater than that of any other one man in the house.

He had been in congress for more than twenty-five years, having been elected first to the fifty-fifth congress. He was re-elected to each succeeding congress. For the past two or three years ill health had forced him to curtail greatly his participation in house affairs.

Mann was a native of Illinois.

FARMERS' RELIEF PLAN IS PERFECTED AT WHITE HOUSE

To Combine Approved Portions of Various Pending Bills in Single Farm Aid Measure.

Washington, Nov. 30.—The new administration program for immediate financial relief to farmers was formulated and practically perfected today at a conference between President Harding, Secretary Wallace and twelve republican senators headed by Senator Watson of Indiana.

It will be put before congress at once and pressed with the full force of the administration. Broadly, the plan brings together in one administration measure the approved portions of various measures already pending in congress, and contains also provisions to make the intended relief available to the small farmer as well as to the large cattle raisers and grain growers.

The conference was arranged by Senator Watson, who had been making an active survey of the question of agricultural relief. It was presided over by a series of conferences between Secretary Wallace and department of agricultural experts.

Today President Harding kept his Thanksgiving dinner waiting while he heard the perfected program outlined and gave his general approval. The plan proposes to utilize the federal farm loan board as the agency through which relief is to be given. The details of the financing have been practically worked out. The general purpose is larger and more liberal credit and cheaper interest rates.

The opinion of those participating in the conference was that while the war finance corporation had been of great value in alleviating the depressed condition of agriculture, its term, because of certain limitations, did not reach down to the average small farmer who raises a few cattle or has small quantities of grain to market. By using the federal farm loan board as the agency to carry out the plan of financing, the new administration plan proposes to make the government relief available directly to the small farmers who need it.

The whole subject of farm relief work was discussed exhaustively, but the marketing problem was touched upon only in a general way. The general opinion at the conference was that to extend the program now to include so complex and much controverted subject as co-operative marketing would only serve to delay the immediate object of the relief. The president was told that the pressing need was to provide an immediate financial aid to thousands of farmers who face mortgage foreclosures because they are unable to dispose of their cattle and crops without tremendous losses.

All the senators present gave their approval to the program and pledged their support for its immediate consideration in congress.
