This contest is all the more of interest to local people because Plattsmouth high school has two contestants entered. The first half of the contest will be held at the Methodist church beginning at two o'clock when the oratorical and humorous division will be held. At 7:15 in the evening, the extemporaneous and dramatic sections will be held in the high school auditorium.

The price of admission to either single sections or for both sections if a ticket is bought in the afternoon is twenty-five cents to everybody.

The building will have an enclosed place for the washing and greasing of cars as well as an office space and rest room for the accommodation of the patrons.

The work of painting the building is now being done by Charles Fulton of this city, who has the painting contract and the electric wiring of the building is being handled by the Allied Electric Co., of Lincoln, who are completing their work and expect to be through by the end of the week.

The construction of the wide driveways across the lot has made a very pleasing improvement in the intersection and gives a wide and sweeping curve on the turn into Sixth street from Vine.
