

Mrs. William Shea, Aged Resident, Found Dead

Deceased Lady Made Home Here for Many Years—Had Lived Alone the Last Few Years.

From Tuesday's Daily This morning Mrs. William Shea, Sr., was found dead at her home in the south portion of the city by her daughter-in-law, Mrs. William Shea, Jr., after she had failed to receive an answer to her telephone message to the Shea home.

The elder Mrs. Shea has resided at the family homestead on Rock Bluffs avenue since the death of her husband a number of years ago, preferring this to making her home with the other members of the family. It has been her custom to call her daughter-in-law, who has charge of the Shea cafe, several times each day and it was this custom that caused the alarm this morning that led to the finding of her lifeless body. Mrs. Shea had failed to call this morning and alarmed by this fact Mrs. Nellie Shea had called the home and failed to receive a response and at once left the restaurant and drove to the home of the mother where Mrs. Shea was found lying on the bed, having apparently passed away several hours before.

The deceased lady was a native of Ireland and came here when a young woman to make her home and it was in this city that she was married to William Shea, then a young blacksmith in the employ of the Burlington railroad in the local shops. Since their marriage the family have resided in the homestead in the south part of the city and where in the scenes of her joys and sorrows the end came to Mrs. Shea.

Mrs. Shea is survived by two daughters and one son, Mrs. Elizabeth Kearns, Minneapolis, Minnesota, Mrs. Winifred O'Malley, Galesburg, Illinois, and William Shea, Jr., of this city.

FORMER RESIDENT DIES

The many Plattsmouth friends will regret to learn of the death of Alexander M. Arries, which occurred at an Omaha hospital late Friday night. Mr. Arries had not been in the best of health for several years since leaving this city to make his home at Omaha had suffered a great deal, being compelled to undergo the amputation of one of his legs. Since the operation Mr. Arries gradually grew worse until his passing.

The deceased was for many years a resident of Fremont where he was engaged in business, coming to Plattsmouth some twenty-two years ago and engaging in the conduct of a recreation parlor here for a great many years. After disposing of his interests here Mr. Arries and wife removed to Omaha where they have made their home.

Mr. Arries was seventy-three years of age and leaves besides his widow, Mrs. Alma Arries, three sons, Major A., Denver; Donald E., Tampa, Florida, and Dr. Byron E. Arries of Omaha.

The funeral services were held this afternoon at the Masonic Temple and in charge of Right Angle Lodge No. 303 A. F. b A. M. The interment was the Forest Lawn cemetery.

Transportation Lines Benefited by Automobiles

Increased Production of Cars Bring Greater Business to Other Lines of Transportation.

Railroads, boat lines, trucking companies, and even air lines greatly benefited by the increased production of automobiles during the first

six months of 1934, according to statistics recently analyzed by the Chevrolet Motor Company.

During this period, automobile companies sold and registered more than a million passenger cars and trucks in the United States alone. The hauling of raw materials to the various factories and the movement of finished cars and trucks from factory to dealer make the automobile industry one of the greatest contributors to transportation revenue.

During this time Chevrolet used 96,973 freight cars and the tonnage moved by means other than rail would have required an additional 63,528 freight cars.

This one motor manufacturer has thus contributed more than \$20,000,000 to the nation's transportation systems. These figures do not include shipments of parts and accessories by airplane, an innovation in

the automotive industry which is growing increasingly popular with dealers everywhere.
