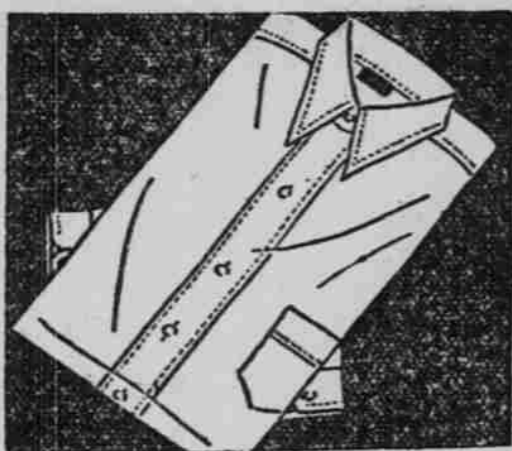

Hope to Reduce Number of Deaths from Drowning

Red Cross Providing School of Instruction at Louisville This Week in Life Saving.

"Drownings this summer will cost this nation more than seven thousand lives if the average yearly toll of water fatalities covering the last ten years is maintained," Mr. Baxter, manager of midwestern area for American Red Cross said. "The purpose of life saving instruction is to reduce drownings by universal training in swimming and in water rescues and resuscitation; by avoiding water accidents through a proper understanding of the hazards involved and the measures to be taken; by encouraging such aquatic programs, facilities and equipment at swimming or bathing places as will keep people out of dangerous situations; by making water sports safe, while at the same time retaining the zest and the thrill; and by insuring a continuing supply of trained leaders."

This is the object that prompted the Cass County Chapter of the American Red Cross establish instruction periods at the state park beach at Louisville, under trained leaders, and it is hoped to have examiners at every pool in Cass county. D. J. Chesneau has been secured by the Chapter to give the instruction this week at the Louisville pool. Classes have been arranged to accommodate everyone, the schedule having previously been published, and being as follows:

- Monday, Wednesday, Friday—9 to 10 a. m.—Girls under 14.
- Tuesday and Thursday, 9 to 10 a. m.—Boys under 14.
- Each day, 10 to 11 a. m.—Ladies and young women over 14.
- Monday, Thursday, Friday, 11 to 12—Junior Life Saving examination.
- Monday, Thursday, Friday, 2 to 3 p. m.—Boys under 14.
- Monday, Thursday, Friday, 3 to 4 p. m.—Junior Life Saving.
- Monday, Thursday, Friday, 4:30 to 5:30—Girls and Ladies.
- Monday, Thursday, Friday, 5:30 to 6:30—Men and Boys, over 14.
- Monday, Thursday, Friday, 6:30 to 8:30—Senior life saving.

It is hoped the pools at Plattsmouth and South Bend will arrange for this service. Both now maintain life guards. Phone or write Mrs. Ray Norris, chairman Life Saving committee, Cass County Chapter, American Red Cross, Weeping Water, and arrange for this instructor to give the full course of life saving methods. Free to all.
