GARDEN OF EDEN TO BLOOM

London.—The Garden of Eden is to bloom again after centuries of desert-like aridity. A firm of London engineers is backing the romantic project, which, at an estimated cost of \$5,600,000, will transform the present barren wastes of the traditional site of the Biblical garden in Asia Minor into a luxuriantly flowering land. Plans call for the construction of a giant dam across the River Tigris. By controlling the flow of the Tigris, the engineers expect to irrigate the land so that it will produce maize, wheat, and cotton. The tract where tradition has placed the story of Adam and Eve lies between the Tigris and the Euphrates.

KILLED BY 'DEATH DEVICE'

Pittsburg.—A "device of death" shot and killed William Cavin as the 58 year old county road foreman tampered with a "no trespassing" sign at a farm where he was an unwelcome visitor. The man's body was found at the foot of the sign by a milkman as he passed the farm of John Nardo, 61, and his daughter, Marion, 27. County detectives are holding Nardo on a district attorney's detainer, pending further investigation.

Detectives Lawrence Kline and William Black say the farmer told them that Cavin had persisted in his attentions to Marion Nardo. Cavin, in charge of road crews in the neighborhood was married and the father of two children.

OIL LANDS DUE AX VICTIM

Anadarko, Okl.—A marital contract giving Mrs. Leta Royce, 45 year old ax victim, valuable oil lands in the event of the death of her husband, William Royce, 74, was discovered while authorities prepared murder charges against him.

The contract was found on file in the office of the county clerk here. It disclosed "Uncle Billy" Royce, colorful treasure oracle of Keechi Hills owned property in addition to his 160 acre farm where Mrs. Royce's body was found. The additional property included oil lands near Cyril and Norge. Assistant County Attorney Fugh said Norge is the home of Mrs. Carrie Royce, first wife of the accused man, and their son-in-law, Reed Norris, 27, who are held for investigation in the slaying.

WILL SELL GUARD TRUCKS

Major H. C. Stein, United States property and disbursing officer, Tuesday announced that seventy-three trucks, formerly used for transportation by the Nebraska national guard, would be sold at public auction here Feb. 11.

Stein also announced that bids for the \$15,000 improvement program at Camp Ashland will be received Feb. 20. Funds for the improvement work are being furnished by the PWA. The project includes a bituminous mat road in the camp and completion of concrete floors beneath the tents of enlisted men.

Stein said the trucks which are being sold had been supplanted by new models, which also were purchased with PWA funds.
