here the postoffice at Elmwood was established, and then came the railroad which was built through the county in 1886 and the towns of Elmwood and Wabash were established. The two little cities were working very hard for the ascendancy and were much alike until the Rock Island was built through Murdock in 1891, thus robbing a portion of the territory which was formerly belonging to Wabash which gave Elmwood the lead and virtually made the city.

During the earlier years of Elmwood, Elam Parmele embarked in the livery business which he conducted for six years, when he disposed of the business and went to Plattsmouth to live. Then SI Mairs came and fitted out a livery stable which he conducted until 1906 and as the automobiles were coming, he sold out, but has always had a warm spot in his heart for a good horse and is a good judge of one now.

Mr. Mairs has been one of the men who made history for this town, along with Cyrus Alton, Silas Green-shale and many others who have resided in this town for the past half century and to be exact, Josiah Mairs has resided in Cass county for fifty-eight years.
