

Miss Meisinger played the wedding march to which the bridal party entered and took their stations for the ceremony. Rev. C. O. Troy, pastor of the First Methodist church, reading the marriage lines.

The bride was attended by her sister, Miss Dorothy, while Mr. Aulton Rolland was the attendant of Mr. Behrens.

**WINENTZ TO OPOSE FISCH**

Trenton, N. J.—An attempt by Pincus and Hannah Fisch, brother and sister of the late Isador Fisch, to collect \$1,500 for expenses incurred during their trip from Germany to the United States, will be opposed by Attorney General Winentz, he said.

The couple were brought to the United States by Detective Arthur Johnson of the New York police department to testify in behalf of their brother, from whom Bruno Richard Hauptmann testified he obtained the \$14,000 Lindbergh baby ransom money found in his garage last September. They say Johnson promised them any losses they incurred would be repaid.

Protesting that they were "held incommunicado" during their stay in the United States, and that they were "financially ruined" by the trip, Pincus and Hannah asked the American consul at Leipzig to collect the money for them. The consul's note was turned over to Governor Hoffman by Secretary of State Hull.
