Delay Operation

She was also told that Price has been charged with Edith's death, and she expressed a willingness to testify for the state against Price. A decompression operation contemplated by her physician, Dr. A. C. Brown, will be delayed for several weeks, he said. Helen will return to the hospital later for the operation, which is designed to prevent any possibility of pressure on the brain by the adjustment of bones of the skull.
