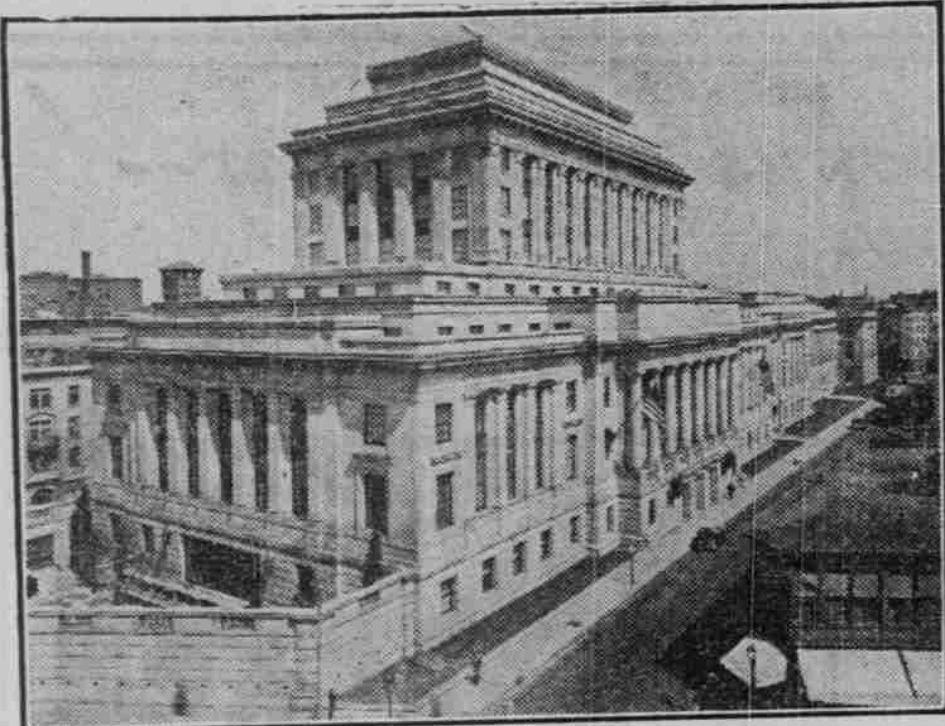


Press Report of the Annual Meeting of The Mother Church, The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, Massachusetts

Thirty-Eight Million Dollars to Nebr. Farmers

Two Wheat Counties Alone Draw a Million in Government Benefits—Money Still Coming.

Washington, June 10.—The corn-hog check pump still is spouting benefit payments into the hands of Nebraska farmers as contract signing for the 1935 program is being speeded. The farm administration announced more than \$28,000,000 has been paid to Nebraska farmers for co-operation in the 1934 corn-hog program.

Falls City, Neb.—On file in district court is a suit asking dissolution of partnership and for an accounting on the Weaver hotel. The action was preferred by Tony Schroedl, hotel manager, against William S. Barkley of Ferguson Falls, Minn., partner in the hotel business. The partnership was formed in June, 1925. The plaintiff asks judgment of \$13,569.90 because of alleged delinquent salary, excess funds drawn from the partnership by the defendant and on a note given him by Barkley. Sale of the assets of the partnership, including equipment in the hotel, is asked, with division of the proceeds among the partners.
