

Report of June Meeting of the County Board

Routine Business and Usual List of Claims to be Passed Upon—Rains Boost Road Work

The County Commissioners of Cass county at their regular monthly session, held June 4th and 5th, transacted (in addition to allowing the various claims listed below) the following business:

Orders of County Judge renewing Mother's Pensions Elizabeth Wright, Edith Krecklow, Nellie Estelle, Lorean Rathbun, Edna Smith, Margie Holcomb and Cleo Capper were approved.

Release of bond of Minnie Hill as Deputy Register of Deeds, effective as of May 21, 1935, approved.

Resolution passed directing John F. Bates, Guardian of Charles L. Bates, incompetent, to receive the sum of \$15 per month from the proceeds of an insurance policy of said Charles L. Bates to prevent the said John F. Bates becoming a charge upon Cass county.
