

WPA Reduces Direct Relief in Cass County

Marked Reduction in Relief Claims Over Last Year—Board Rejects Young Cemetery Road.

At sessions of the County Commissioners held on December 3rd and 4th, the following business was transacted:

Orders by County Judge revoking Mother's Pension of Hazel Jamison, Plattsmouth; reducing Mother's Pension of Edna A. Jones and placing Mother's Pension of Ida N. Cotner in joint control of Ida N. Cotner and Mrs. Lottie Rosenkrans, approved by the Board.

Petition for the establishment of a new road to Young's cemetery in Section 12-11-13, which had been under consideration for some time, was rejected by the Board, the expense being considered too high to warrant the establishment of said road.

At the session of December 4, further orders by the County Judge renewing Mother's Pensions of Maggie Holcomb, Catherine Falk, Nellie Estelle, Edith Krecklow, Cleo Capper and Elizabeth Wright were approved by the Board.

Resignation of John Mefford as assessor in Salt Creek precinct, which had been filed with the Clerk was accepted.

Bid for publishing the official proceedings of the County Board at 1c per line was submitted by the Weeping Water Republican and accepted. Two bids were filed for county burial, that of Streight & Streight and the Sattler Funeral Home. The bid of the former was accepted.

For services at county physician in district No. 6, the bid of Dr. M. J. Buzza in the amount of 150.00 was rejected by the Board.
