Violent Deaths Mark Sunday in the Metropolis
Automobile Accident Claims One—Fire Causes Three Deaths in Council Bluffs Sunday.

OMAHA, July 12. (UP)—Six persons met violent deaths in the Omaha metropolitan area over the week-end. Four of the deaths were in Council Bluffs.

Fire of unknown origin cost the lives of Hugh R. McAlexander, 33, bookkeeper for the Farm loan bank in Omaha, his wife, Edith, 28, and his mother, Mrs. Fannie McAlexander, 71. The fire trapped the three in the upper floor of their Council Bluffs home and enveloped them as they debated whether to leap out of a window 25 feet to the ground beneath. Firemen found the three bodies huddled together at the window. The McAlexander's were awakened by Fred Quackenbush, a neighbor, who hunted the neighborhood vainly for a ladder. The fire occurred at 3 Sunday morning.

Everett Stanley, 19, Council Bluffs high school athlete, was drowned in Lake Manawa Sunday morning. He was hanging onto a rowboat being paddled by a younger brother and another boy when he suddenly let go and sank.

On the Nebraska side of the river two motor traffic accident victims were added to the 1937 traffic toll. Otto Eriksen, 59, a prominent Ralston business man was killed, his wife, Anna, 53, and son, Warren, 13, injured when their car collided with a stock truck outside South Omaha. Mrs. Eriksen was reported in critical condition this morning. The boy will recover. Joe Zajick, Crete, driver of the truck, suffered only minor injuries, as did Earl Newton of Plattsmouth who was riding with him. The Eriksen car was found in a six foot ditch. Eriksen owned the Ralston Elevator Co.

A head-on collision Sunday night between a bakery truck and a street car cost the life of Wolf Jonsch, 51, the truck driver. He died at a hospital early today of a skull fracture. He was Omaha's 24th traffic victim of the year.
