Thus, slightly over four acres of land brought them a return of \$255 for the seed and they had a goodly supply of hay left for feed. 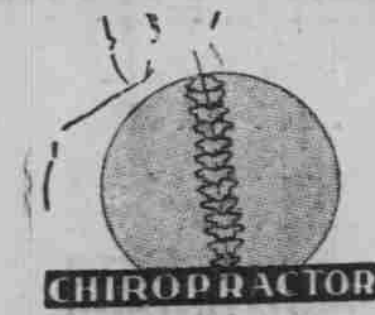

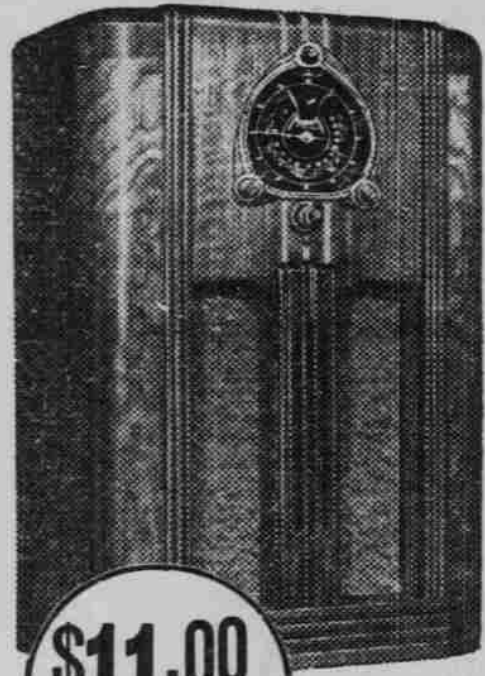
