4-H Sale at Ak-Sar-Ben Sets a New Record

Cass County Exhibitors Find Excellent Prices Paid for Their Exhibited Livestock.

4-H club members from Cass county that exhibited livestock at Ak-Sar-Ben and sold them in the sale last Friday, may be many years older before they sell steers, barrows and lambs at the prices they received last week. The eighteen baby beefs averaged \$17.50 per hundred pounds, the average weight being about 925 pounds. Seven fat barrows averaging about two hundred pounds, sold for \$11.25 per hundred, while eight fat weathers averaged \$12.45 per hundred and weighed about 100 pounds.

The highest priced steer belonging to Myrl Kunz of Elmwood, brought \$20.50 per hundred after winning third place in his class. Harold D'Almeida exhibited a calf that placed 5th and sold to the University of Nebraska cafeteria for \$18.75 per hundred.

Clyde Althouse of Eagle sold his calf that was grand champion at the county fair, for \$19.50 per hundred.
