

FARM INCOME UP

WASHINGTON, Jan. 25 (UP)—Farmers last year had a total cash income of \$8,521,000,000, the department of agriculture reported today. This was \$600,000,000 above 1936 cash income of \$7,920,000,000 and \$21,000,000 above the estimate on Jan. 1 for last year. Government payments to farmers in 1937 totaled \$367,000,000 compared with \$287,000,000 in 1936.
