State Committee Announces Soil Allotment

Announce Soil Depleting Areas and Also the 6,700,000 Acre Corn Allotment.

LINCOLN, March 28 (UP)—The state agricultural conservation committee today announced distribution of the 15,000,000 acre Nebraska soil depleting allotment among the 93 counties and the 6,700,000 acre corn allotment in the 64 commercial corn counties.

Chairman Fred Wallace of the committee said the total depleting allotment that about three-fourths of Nebraska crop land would be planted to depleting crops such as corn, wheat, oats, barley, rye, beets and potatoes in 1938, if all farmers participated in the federal farm program for full pay.

He said this proportion corresponds closely with the acreage planted by participating farmers since 1934.

County and community committees may require several weeks to divide the allotment among individual farms. Meanwhile, the state committee suggested that each farmer should compare his farm with the county average as to slope, erosion, productivity and past crop history and adjust accordingly his planted acreage.
