More Cass Co. Youths to CMTC is Announced

Three More Can Be Enrolled to FHL Cass County Quota—Ten Are Already Enrolled.

A limited number of additional Cass county youths may file applications to attend this summer's Citizens' Military Training camps, if they are prompt to act, it was announced today by J. A. Capwell of Plattsmouth, chairman of the local committee in charge of camp enrollment.

The quota in this county is 13, and to date applications have been received from 10 young men. Advice from army headquarters in Omaha indicates the total procurement quota for Nebraska is rapidly nearing completion. In order to receive consideration for the camps, young men who are interested are urged to apply promptly.

Any young man of good character and sound physique who is between 17 and 24 years is eligible to apply for enrollment. No obligation for future military service of any kind is incurred by attendance. The government pays all necessary expenses, including transportation to camp and return, wholesome food, uniforms, athletic equipment, laundry service, and medical attention.

Camps run for thirty days. Shooting with the army rifle or pistol, hiking, camping, athletics, drilling, and citizenship studies form the basis for the camp instruction. Recreation programs include movies, dances, and occasional trips to nearby points of interest.

Youths from this county who have not attended a previous C.M.T.C. encampment will be assigned to the basic course opening July 19 at Fort Crook, Nebraska.
