CONTRACT FOR IZARD SEWER

Council Awards it Over Protest of City Engineer.

ROSEWATER SAYS BID TOO HIGH

Water Board Gets Rejected for Failure to Do Anything for People Who Desire Change in Hydrants.

By a vote of 5 to 4 the council, in committee of the whole, decided yesterday to award the contract for the Izard street sewer to James Rosewater, the president of City Engineer Rosewater, who declared the bid at least \$10,000 too high.

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Roast for Water Board. The Omaha Water board came in for a "roast" at the hands of Committees McGovern and Elissaser because it has done nothing practical for people who desire mains and change of hydrants.

Representative of owners of a strip of land affected by the opening of Cass street, between Thirty-third and Thirty-sixth streets, appeared from the report of the appraisers. He asked "something in the neighborhood of \$2,500" for what appraisers awarded \$711.

During the hearing of the question of the license on the Burwood theater it was brought out that the theater had paid no license during 1906 nor for 1907 to date.

Contractors were requested to lay no brick walks on Frederick street, between Twenty-fourth and Thirtieth streets, until further orders.

Report of assessors on the opening of a street near Twentieth was rejected. John E. Reagan and other members of the Board of Appraisers of the Northwest boulevard presented a bill for services rendered on the street.

William Gorey Gets Alternative Write Compelling Justice to Release His Wages.

Claiming exemptions under the new law, William Gorey has secured an alternative writ of mandamus from Judge Sutton to compel Justice W. W. Eastman to release from garnishment \$25, representing wages due him from the Chicago, St. Paul, Minneapolis & Omaha railroad.

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COAST ARTILLERY'S RECORD

Makes Perfect Score Against Moving Target with Twelve-Inch Guns in West.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 14.—Record target practice has been made by the 11th company, coast artillery, now stationed at Fort Rosecrans, Cal., which by the way, has heretofore stood first in the matter of accuracy of fire. In this last case the command made 100 per cent of hits on a moving target at a mean range of 5,988 yards and six shots from the big twelve-inch guns were fired in five minutes and 45 seconds.

CORN ON THE JUDGESHIP

Assistant United States Attorney Discusses Alaskan Situation.

TELLS WHY WICKERSHAM QUIT

Judge Had Knowledge of Affairs of the Territory and His Leaving is Loss to the Country.

Harry L. Cohn, assistant United States attorney for Alaska, is in Omaha on a month's leave of absence, which he will spend at his old home here. He will return to the frozen north about the middle of December, going over the trail from Valdez to Fairbanks on sleds.

"The resignation of Judge James Wickersham from the bench of the Third Judicial district of Alaska ends a peculiar political fight. For four years Wickersham has held the position of judge without success appointment. The objection to his confirmation in the senate was made by Senators Nelson and McCumber and it is claimed the opposition of these two men came by reason of an adverse ruling by Wickersham in a copper case over which it is known as the Valdez case.

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CHILDREN KILLED BY TRAIN

Feet Caught in Cattle Guard in Front of a Lake Shore Freight Train.

LORAIN, O., Oct. 14.—Matthew Glovoick, 5-year-old, and his sister, Lucy, 11 years old, were run down by a Lake Shore train and killed last night on a crossing near Antherist, and their aunt, Miss Sophia Glovoick, was fatally hurt.

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CAUSE OF ORIENTAL RUSH

Secretary of State of Canada Receives News of Reason for Invasion.

OTTAWA, Oct. 14.—The secretary of state has received a telegram from Mr. Munro, the immigration agent at Vancouver stating that the number of Japanese arriving at Vancouver with passports since January 1 was 3,000. About three-fourths of these came from Honolulu, or were destined for the United States.

FARMERS GET BIG RETURNS

High Prices for Cereals in North Dakota Good for Tillers of the Soil.
