NEBRASKA WINS HARD GAME

Mountaineers Prove Doughty Foes and Make Stubborn Fight.

CAPTAIN WELLS CHIEF SCORER

Points Are Twenty-Two to Eight, but Teams Are More Evenly Matched Than Figures Indicate.

LINCOLN, Oct. 26.—(Special Telegram.)—Nebraska today discovered Colorado all it had been reputed to be, and more. The Cornhuskers found it necessary to work against their husky opponents from the mountains.

For once luck came to the assistance of the Cornhuskers in their extremity and enabled them to make a wider difference in the score than the comparative strength of the two teams appeared to justify.

Colorado played a sturdy game on the defense, foiling almost every attempt of the Cornhuskers to gain, either through the line or around the ends.

On the offense the visitors were almost as strong as on the defense, and presented a variety of passes and tricks that baffled the Nebraska players time after time.

Once the visitors worked a forward pass for a gain of sixty yards, fifty of which were made on a single play.

Nebraska's other two points were scored on another long punt by Wells to Stritt, the ball was caught behind Colorado's goal, and Stritt started back into the gridiron with it.

Colorado played a fierce game, and when the half closed had forced the ball to Nebraska's fifteen-yard line, though the Cornhuskers had possession of it when the whistle blew.

Second Half. Wells opened the second half by kicking off to Roberts. Colorado lost ten yards in the first two downs, Nebraska a playing a much more aggressive game than in the first half.
