FOURTH RECEIVER FOR STEEL CO.

Judge Hundley Appoints Colonel T. G. BUSH as fourth receiver in the bankruptcy case of the Southern Steel Company. Receivers J. O. Thompson and E. G. Chandler represented to the court that there was a lack of harmony between themselves and Receiver Edgar A. Adler. It is understood that Colonel Bush will be made chairman of the board of receivers, and will be able to raise the \$100,000 estimated necessary to operate the plants for the next sixteen days.

In the last year there has been considerable trouble over the electric light franchise matters here and it was brought about shortly after the arrest of C. C. King, the Standard banker. With his arrest the Mitchell Gas company, of which he was the president, went into the hands of a receiver, for the benefit of the parties in St. Louis who hold the greater share of the bonded indebtedness.
