CORNHUSKERS THE VICTORS

Ames, However, Gives the Nebraska Squad a Battle Royal.

FINAL SCORE IS TEN TO NINE

Dope on Form Which Had Figured the Two Teams Nearly Equal, Worked Out Right on This Occasion.

LINCOLN, Nov. 2.—(Special Telegram.)—A single point was the margin by which the Nebraska Cornhuskers this afternoon defeated Ames, after by all odds the most exciting game ever played on Nebraska's field. Two goals from the field by Weller, coupled with an excusable safety by Willett, were sufficient to give Nebraska the victory, but the visitors played a magnificent game, kept Nebraska on the run during the greater part of the second half, and, had they possessed no dependable kicker as Weller, would have won hands down. The final score was 10 to 9. Ames scoring twice in the second half on Cy Lambert's goal from the field and his touchdown from which he failed to kick goal.

The game was fiercely fought during every minute of the seventy for which it ran. Outplaying the visitors completely in the first half, the Cornhuskers were yet unable to score more than the four points made by Weller's first field goal early in the contest. Had Luck, pursued the Cornhuskers throughout the period, and though forcing the ball within striking distance of the visitors' goal on several occasions, they were still balked in their efforts to lug it across. During the final half, however, the conditions were almost reversed. Luck came to the rescue of Nebraska. Ames played Nebraska completely off its feet during the first twenty-five minutes of the half.

Forward Pass a Winner—A forward pass, which Ames had no chance to call into use during the game, was presented, and worked even better to the Cornhuskers than did the one used by Colorado. It was by means of this play that the visitors carried the ball very close to Nebraska's goal five times they essayed goals.

Nerved by their long posture Ames started after the Cornhuskers. Twice more they carried the ball into Nebraska's territory and again in their efforts to carry it across the line for goals from the field. Attempts were unsuccessful, but at one, after missing up the pass from placement, Cy Lambert kicked the ball and scored a point. The Cornhusker's line for the only of the game. He failed to kick.

With the score 9 to 4 against the Cornhuskers showed the stiff made of. Though only a few minutes remained for play, they went back to the fight once more with a determination that inspired the Nebraska players to a frenzied safety is opposed.

The kickoff, which followed Lambert's touchdown, resulted in a safety touchdown, which was wholly unearned by Nebraska. The two points scored on the play seemed like a veritable godsend. Nebraska carried the ball to Ames' eighty-yard line and threatened to score a touchdown. Ames braced, however, and kicked out of temporary danger. Undimmed by their failure, the Cornhuskers came back with splendid courage. Kroger and Weller carried the ball back to the fifty-yard line. Here Ames made a final stand, but after two ineffective efforts to gain Weller dropped back and executed his second goal from placement. The kick was made at the very far end of the game, and was enough to win.

Celebration Most Intense.—Tonight the students are celebrating with more vehemence than they have used since the Cornhuskers defeated Minnesota five years ago.

Only one incident marred the struggle. Late in the first half just after he had not off, most, Cooke was tackled with considerable violence by Pathek Reppert, one of the stars of the Ames team. On the next kick off Nebraska scored two unearned points which later proved sufficient to defeat the visitors. Weller kicked off to Willett, who had succeeded Reppert as fullback. The ball was caught by Willett just inside the goal line. The Ames man, thinking he was already behind the line, stepped back and touched the ball down, scoring a safety touchdown instead of the touchdown he desired to make. This made the score Nebraska 6, Ames 9.

Nebraska realized that time was nearly exhausted, kicked a bunch of demons for the victory they so nearly lost. Following Willett's safety, Thayer kicked out from the 23-yard line to Minor, who fumbled the catch. Cooke saved the ball on the next play, by a fake which those in the bleachers were unable to fathom, and carried it to the 33-yard line. Here Ames braced and took the ball on downs on its 23-yard line. The ball was brought into the gridiron five yards in order to permit Thayer to punt. OMAHA WINS OVER LEATRICE

Local High School Has Superior Knowledge of Game.

SCORE TWENTY-SIX TO NOTHING

Splendid Support of Entire Student Body is Accorded Home Team and This Spurs It On.

The big bell in the Omaha High school tower tolled forth the fact Saturday night that the foot ball team of that institution had beaten the husky team from the Beatrice High school by the score of 26 to 0 at Diets park, in one of the best attended foot ball games of the season.

The local boys won because of superior knowledge of the fine points of the new game, which permitted them to work tricks to advantage. Omaha excelled in end runs and in the kicking branch of the game as well as in tackling, while the Beatrice line showed itself to be a stone wall toward the latter part of the game and held the Omaha line from a touchdown when they had three trials within the five-yard line.

The game was characterized largely by the superb support accorded the team by practically the entire student body of the Omaha High school, as well as by a large number of the teachers on hand to witness the game. The field, with its green turf, presented a pretty sight, lined as it was by a solid phalanx of students decorated with the high school colors of purple and white. The large number of girls also was a noticeable feature and marked a vast difference from the support which has been accorded high school teams during the last two or three years.

Captain Letenser won the toss and chose to kick off, giving Beatrice the advantage of a slight wind from the northwest. Selby kicked and the ball was returned fifteen yards by Warren, and Fullback Krause immediately kicked the ball over Lehm's head to the Omaha five-yard line, where he was tackled. Selby booted the ball back thirty-five yards and Mulligan was downed in his tracks by Howard. Beatrice was given five yards for an offside play and Omaha took the ball on downs.

Four yards were made by Entriens around the right end McKinney made five. Omaha kicked to the fifteen-yard line and Beatrice returned the ball to Selby, who ran it back twenty yards. Beatrice was given twenty yards on a miscue by the Omaha quarter and McKinney made a beautiful twenty-five-yard run. The ball was carried along and lost on downs on the two-yard line, from which place Beatrice kicked into safe territory. A forward pass gave Omaha fifteen yards, when Warren was forced to retire and Reker went to left end and Mulligan to quarter. Beatrice kicked for a touchdown and Selby kicked out from the twenty-five yard line. Beatrice returned the kick twenty-five yards and Lehner ran the ball back fifteen yards. A forward pass was called by Busey, who took the ball ten yards into Omaha territory. Beatrice fell down on a forward pass and Omaha kicked and recovered the ball. A quarter back kicked gave Omaha ten yards and McKinney missed a try at goal. Breen recovering the ball it was worked to the goal line and Letenser was shoved over, McKinney kicking the goal, making the score 10 to 0. The Omaha team then played a beautiful play, which resulted in a touchdown and McKinney kicked for a touchdown. Beatrice again kicked for a touchdown. Omaha kicked the ball to the middle of the field and recovered the ball. McKinney made fifteen yards around the end and five yards on a buck and Letenser made five yards. McKinney was soon put over the goal line by Selby, who held it for a time, and as the Beatrice man approached he kicked it over all their heads to Letenser, who had stayed back. The big captain ran for sixty-five yards for a touchdown with the entire Beatrice team at his heels, but was tackled by Selby. A goal was kicked, making the score 16 to 0.

After the change McKinney was given the ball and on a tackle plunge went seven yards for a touchdown and then kicked a goal, making the score 21 to 0. For the remainder of the game the ball was in Omaha territory. Beatrice tried to make a play but was unable to carry it over. A safety was forced, however. Beatrice held the Omaha team inside the five-yard line and was forced to kick. The kick was blocked, but did not cross the line until a Beatrice man helped it across by trying to fall upon it, and thus a safety was scored against Beatrice, making the final score 26 to 0.

Charles ton took McKinney's place toward the close of the game, but he did something which caused the umpire to put him out of commission and Gardner took his place. The Beatrice team was entertained at Boyd's theater last night by the Omaha team.
