## FEWEST MEN LAID OFF HERE

Least Number of Workmen Suspended in Omaha Than Any City.

## STATE'S METROPOLIS STEMS TIDE

While Other Industrial Centers Are Laying Off Thousands of Men Omaha is Keeping Practically All at Work.  
Among all the industrial cities of the United States Omaha has kept its workmen busy when many cities have reported the lay-off of from 500 to 1,000 men. The total number of men in Omaha laid off for various reasons will not exceed 100, according to railroad superintendents and managers of factories and mills.  
A list of the cities where laborers have been thrown out of work has been received at the Commercial club and while Omaha goes through with a minimum number of men out of work, cities such as St. Paul report 6,000 men have been thrown out of employment by the closing of saw mills; sixty city engineers discharged by the Great Northern and 4,000 miners out of work. In Florida 300 men and women in factories are out of work and several

## Music

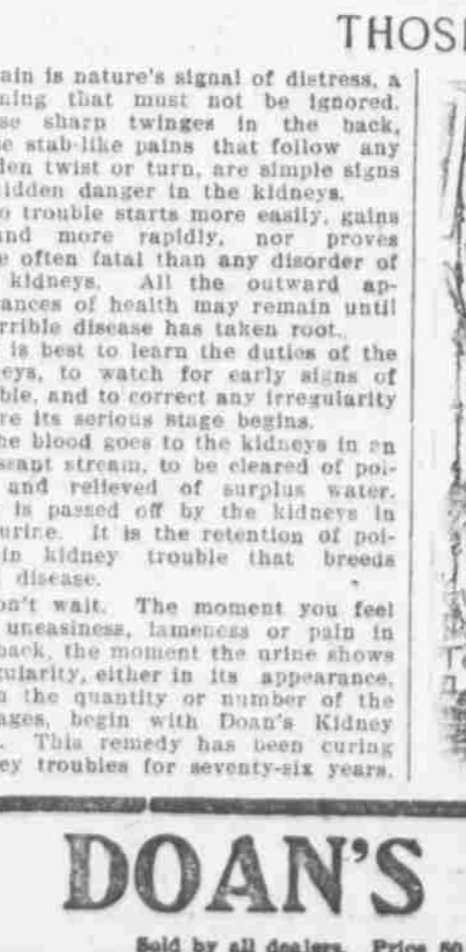
