NEW AUTO SPEED ORDINANCE

Measure Will Be Introduced by Brucker with Minimum of Eight Miles. At the meeting of the city council Tuesday night Councilman Brucker will introduce an ordinance to regulate the speed of automobiles in the city. He says he has wanted to do so for several weeks, but there was some question of the state law, which prevents cities from levying a license fee on the machines. The legal department has determined that the council can regulate the speed of automobiles under the law and the ordinance is now being prepared. The speed will vary in different parts of the city, a minimum of eight miles an hour being fixed for the business streets and those streets and avenues where there is considerable traffic, while the maximum which will apply to boulevards and similar places is not announced.
