PRESIDENT ROOSEVELT TO THE CONGRESS

WHAT THE PRESIDENT URGES ON CONGRESS AS IMPORTANT

Amendment of the Sherman anti-trust law so as to forbid only the kind of combination which does harm to the general public.

Urges compulsory investigation and arbitration of industrial disputes.

Favors prosecution by the government of plans for a systematic improvement of inland waterways and the extension of the work of reclaiming the arid lands by irrigation.

Suggests government control of grazing lands, with provision that the necessary portion of the revenues derived from leasing be spent in paying to the state or county the equivalent of what it would otherwise receive in taxes.

Presents a strong plea for the extension of the forest reserve policy and the conservation of the nation's timber resources.

Approves the postmaster general's plan for the establishment of a postal savings bank and the extension of the parcel post system.

Declares that the process of injunction is an essential power of the court, but severely censures the reckless or unnecessary use of it.

Asks congress to make early and liberal provision for taking the census of 1910.

Suggests that congress provide for the legitimate campaign expenses of each of the great political parties.

Favors national investigation of the causes of accidents to railway employees; urges legislation providing for definite compensation for accidents to all workmen within the scope of federal power.

Reviews our relations with foreign countries.
