County Attorney Hesse Serves Notice Upon All Saloon Keepers. ORDER EFFECTIVE NEXT SUNDAY

Beginning that Day Screens Must Be Removed and Bar Rooms Must Be Kept Closed from 10 P. M. to 5 A. M.

On and after Sunday, December 15, saloons in Council Bluffs are to be conducted strictly according to the mulct law.

When seen yesterday Mr. Hesse said: "While Attorney General Byers suggested that the enforcement of the provisions of the mulct law be begun at once, I decided that no harm would be done by allowing the saloons men one week in which to make the necessary changes in their places."

Under the mulct law there can be no screens, swinging doors or anything else that will prevent a view of the interior from the outside.

UNIFORM COUNTY ACCOUNTS

Commission Appointed by Iowa Legislature Stamped with Work. FIVE HUNDRED FORMS ADOPTED

Only Partial Report Can Be Made by First of Year—Opposition to Congressman Hull is Developing.

DES MOINES, Dec. 9.—(Special.)—The Uniform County Accounts Commission, organized and the chances are it will have to get together a hastily arranged report, file it with Auditor Carroll and call the work done.

The commission has adopted 500 blank forms to be used in the county treasurers' offices of the state, 114 blanks for the auditors, and there will be about 200 blanks for the county clerks.

It was the expectation of the legislature and of Auditor Carroll as well that the commission would be able to formulate a report inside of a few days.

County Clerk Dwell of Algona turned over his office to his deputy and has been working ever since the first meeting of the commission on the blanks to be used in county clerks' offices.

"BLUE SUNDAY" IN NEW YORK

All Places of Amusement Closed by Order of Police. FEW ATTEMPTS TO EVADE LAW

Broadway is Deserted for the First Time—Lid Campaigns in Kansas City and Chicago.

NEW YORK, Dec. 9.—New York, which can usually be depended on to provide something new and sensational, yesterday treated its millions of residents and tens of thousands of week-end visitors to the novelty of a thoroughly "blue Sunday," the first and probably the last in the history of the metropolis.

Incidentally, the police department demonstrated that it was equally effective in enforcing obnoxious or popular statutes. The aldermen will meet Thursday to modify the ordinances so far as their authority goes.

The effect of the Sunday closing was everywhere apparent. Broadway was deserted except for those who found nothing better to do than to walk the streets. The hush throughout the great white way was painful to ears accustomed to the week day noises and Sunday harmonies.

Police Asked to Enforce Law. CHICAGO, Dec. 9.—New tactics were employed by the Chicago Law and Order league in its warfare on Sunday saloons today.

Another honored institution which found it necessary to abbreviate its usual program was the Educational alliance, where Sunday lectures and entertainments of an instructive character have long been held.

Saloons Are Not Closed. The blue Sunday restraint was applied only to places of amusement and tonight some of the theatrical men declared that from a saloon standpoint the town was unusually free from law.
