NEWS OF THE ARMY POSTS. Six General Court-Martial Sentences for Minor Offenses Are Approved. The following general court martial sentences have been approved and promulgated from army headquarters, Department of the Missouri: Privates Franklin McCord, Company M, Infantry, for desertion, eighteen months' imprisonment; William B. Parker, alias W. B. Porter, Battery B, Fifth Field Artillery, for fraudulent enlistment and desertion, one year's imprisonment; Charles Vassar, Company D, Fourth Infantry, for larceny and desertion, one year's imprisonment; William H. Patterson, for desertion, one year's imprisonment; Bert Smith, for desertion, one year's imprisonment. The sentences in each instance carry with them dishonorable discharge from the army. The imprisonment sentences will be carried out at Leavenworth military prison.

Considerable experimental wireless telegraph work is now being done with the portable apparatus which consists of telescoping iron poles with necessary wire guy cables. The current is produced from storage batteries and gasoline generators for the dynamo. The work is being done almost wholly on the post grounds.
