

ELEVATION FEE RESTORED

Grain Allowance Will Be Revived by Northwestern. GOES INTO EFFECT JANUARY 16

Three-Fourth Cent Per Bushel on All Shipments to the Twin Cities and Duluth, Same as Before.

After cancelling the elevation allowance of 3/4 cents per bushel September 26, on all grain destined to Minneapolis, St. Paul and Duluth, the Northwestern railroad notified grain dealers that the allowance would be restored.

The action of the Northwestern in pulling out the elevation charge was looked upon with much disfavor by the grain dealers, as it was feared other roads would follow the example set by the Northwestern.

Plenty of Grain Cars Now. Railroads have a surplus of cars for grain shipments for the first time since the establishment of a grain market in Omaha, according to shippers, and the closing of the Union Pacific car shops, with more than 200 cars in the repair shop, will not cause a falling off in grain receipts.
